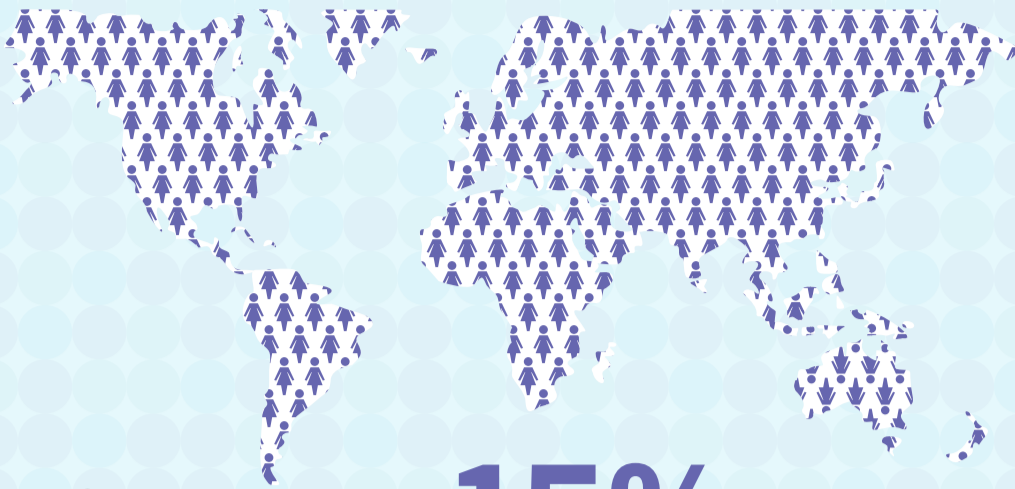
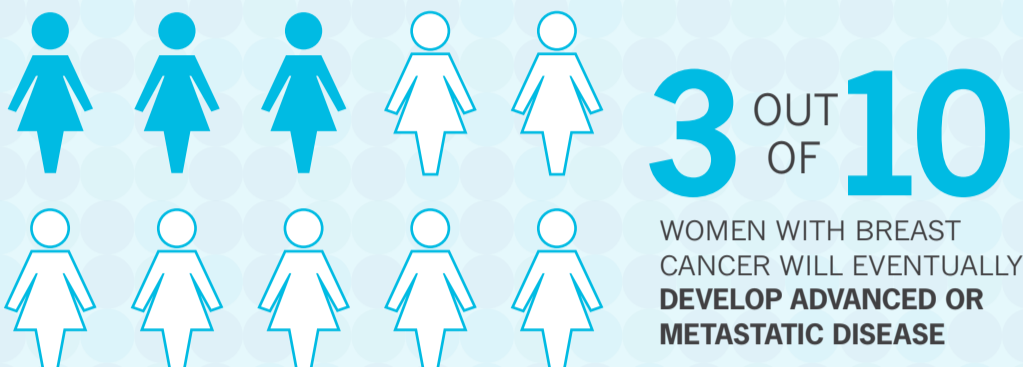


ADVANCED BREAST CANCER BY THE NUMBERS

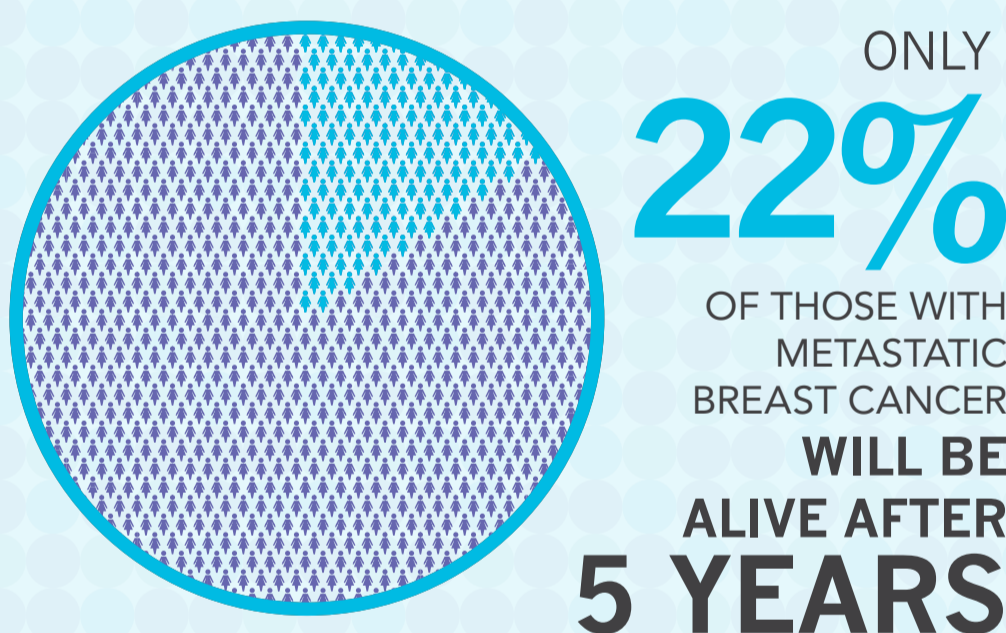
THAT IS **15%** OF ALL BREAST CANCER DIAGNOSES
