What?

My Migraine Voice is the



LARGEST GLOBAL STUDY of migraine patients ever undertaken.



It took place September 2017 to February 2018.

It involved more than

11,000 patients from 31 countries who experienced 4 or more migraine days each month.



Why?

Migraine is recognised by WHO* as one of the

TOP 10 CAUSES of years lost to disability.¹

aimed to uncover the total burden of migraine using real world experience

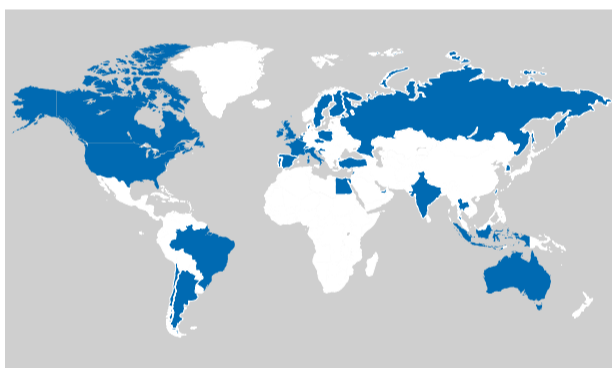


Where?

My Migraine Voice was a global, online study in 31 countries.

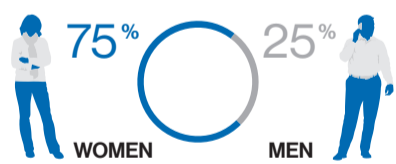

Who?

More than 11,000 people took part in the My Migraine Voice Study.



63% have children

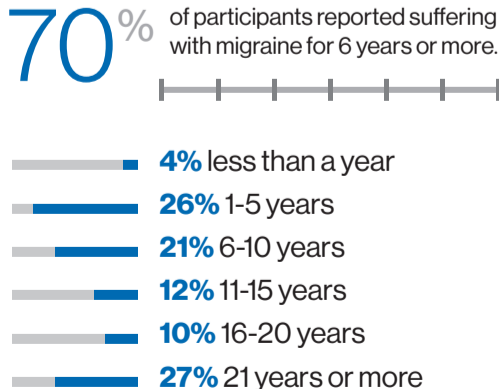
53% AGED 30-49 (24%: 18-29, 22%: 50-74)

47% were employed full time and 19% were self-employed or part time.

56% MARRIED (28% single, 8% divorced, 1% widowed, 7% other)

Personal Experience

54% reported a family history of migraine.
